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- Coupon book sales (Janet) will start in February stay tuned for more information. This year we hope students can sell a few books each, to families and neighours. More information will be available within the next month or so.
- Planning for spring fundraisers like Hilltop and Purdy's will be discussed in more detail at the February meeting (Chelle)
- Pink Shirt Day t-shirt orders (Chelle) complete. We do not yet know the anticipated delivery date stay tuned! Families who missed out and would like to be waitlisted for the small number of extra shirts we ordered are reminded to send an e-mail to janet@questioneverything.com with your size request (see sizing info on our social media posts, sizing is roughly equivalent to one size larger than uniform shirts (i.e. uniform CM would likely be child small for the pink shirt). Cost will be between \$25 and \$28.
- Chelle will look into options for potentially creating a tapestry of all of the 25 designs submitted for the contest, as a school memento to be discussed by the PAC executive once more information is available. A report will be provided at the next PAC general meeting.
- Auction/community event there was much discussion about the challenges of already busy
 volunteers planning a large auction event. Without a school marketing person to assist, the PAC is
 leaning towards a smaller-scale community event, with less focus on fundraising and more focus
 on connecting our community. Kim will look into some location options and costs and report
 back for further discussion amongst the PAC executive and at the next general meeting.
- Tea/coffee mornings outside the school entrance next one planned for Wednesday, February 5th.
 More information will be included in the Evening Update and PAC social media updates. We hope all parents/caregivers can stop by and say hi, grab a warm drink, ask questions, and provide feedback. PAC executive will be present as well as Magnus and potentially some board members.
- Bottle Drive: Caitlin Dunahee is coordinating. Details have been provided in evening updates. We are looking into options to allow people to drop off their large bottle stores in advance if possible

This item was deferred to the next meeting in order to allow for discussion with a potential candidate. Any interested parents/guardians are invited to contact <u>janet@questioneverything.com</u> to express interest and/or ask questions.

Board Liaison Update (Janet)

There being no substantive update as the January board meeting was scheduled to occur a few hours after this meeting, this item was deferred to the next meeting.

A few items were raised and discussed:

- Love of Books Tea (February 12th, 2025) the PAC usually provides funds to off-set the costs of this event, which is both the library's largest annual source of new books, and a beloved event by the school community, including many alumni who continue to attend. Details are in the Evening Update. The librarian requested up to \$350 from the PAC to assist with this year's event, noting that costs have been kept very low due to a few individuals donating supplies such as the teas and assorted accroutrements.
 - ➔ Motion: by Chelle, seconded by Sumitra, to approve up to \$350 in funding for the library to cover costs for the tea event approved unanimously.
- Communications: the ongoing challenge of getting information out in a way that works for everyone was discussed. It was noted that the weekly Evening Update sent by Magnus every Friday/Sunday is the best single source of information; much time is spent each week preparing the information that goes into it and it is worth the read to the end, especially as the PAC info often comes towards the end. It was suggested that a regular PAC newsletter might be a good way to get information out directly to people. The PAC executive will try to create a template for a monthly one-pager "at a glance" type summary to test during the spring.
- A few attendees wanted to know the status of the speed signs as well as the school entrance sign, given that the funds raised at last year's auction were supposed to be used for signage. As Magnus could not attend this meeting due to the electrical emergency (subsequently resolved), we will report out on this at the next general meeting.
- Concerns were raised with some drivers' conduct in the school parking lot; parking attendants have observed a concerning rising trend of some aggressive drivers and close calls, mostly due to excessive speed and undue attention. The PAC reminds everyone that all of our children have a right to be safe at all times on school grounds, and that unsafe driving or other behaviour on school roads and parking lots will not be tolerated. Attendees suggested speed limit signs along the driveways; the PAC executive will follow-up and propose further action in consultation with Magnus.
